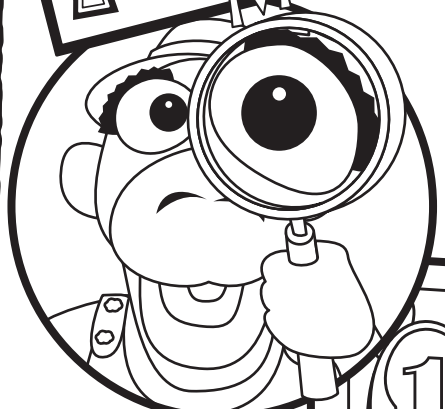

# Dollar Bill Fun Facts

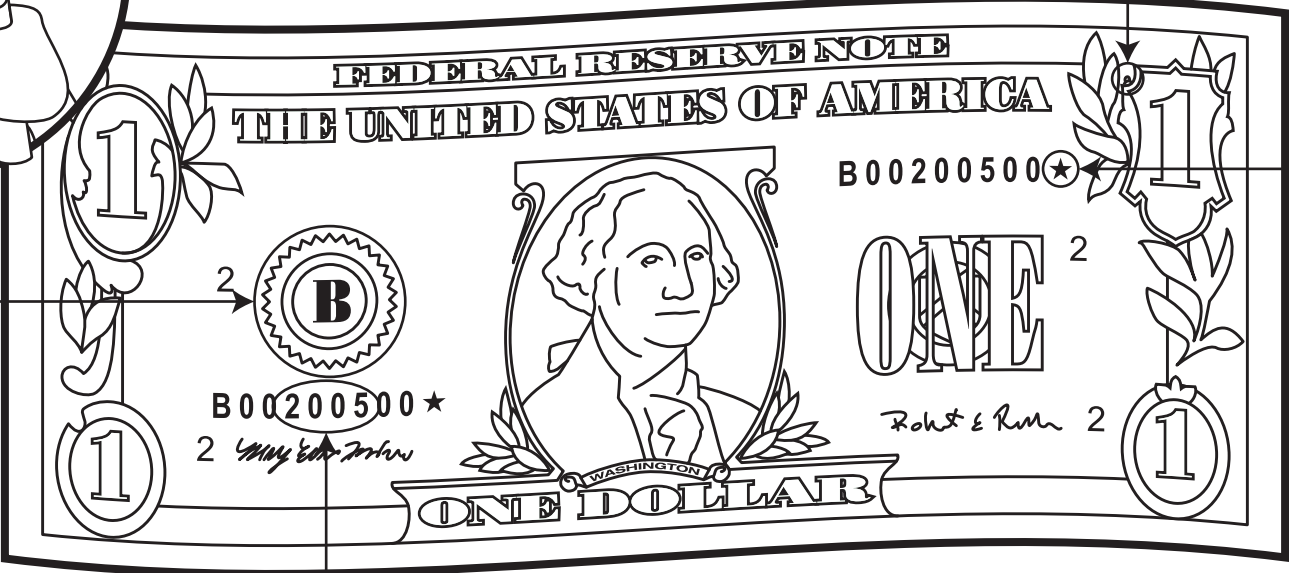

If you look at a dollar bill closely, you will find what appears to be either a little spider or a tiny owl at the top right. This symbol is part of the webbed design and is not intentional.

The big black letter tells you which Federal Reserve bank ordered the bill. Here's the key:

- A= Boston
- B= New York City
- C= Philadelphia
- D= Cleveland
- E= Richmond, VA
- F= Atlanta
- G= Chicago
- H= St. Louis
- I= Minneapolis
- J= Kansas City
- K= Dallas
- L= San Francisco



When you find a bill with a star at the end of the serial number, there was a printing error during production and the bill needed to be reprinted. These are called replacement notes or "star bills".

Many people collect dollar bills that have their birthday in the serial number. For example, if you were born in 2005, you would look for a bill that had "2005" somewhere in the number.

Did you know you can track where your dollar bill has been, using its serial number? If your bill has been in circulation long enough, you might be able to find it on Where's George ([www.wheresgeorge.com](http://www.wheresgeorge.com)), a website dedicated to tracking paper currency.
